#### Venus is Shining Bright In February

In February 2025, the most prominent space observation you can make at home is the planet Venus, which will be visible in the west-southwest sky shortly after sunset, shining exceptionally bright throughout the month; you can even use Venus as a guide to locate Saturn nearby with binoculars or a telescope if sky conditions are good. Take time with your child(ren) to look to the sky to identify these remarkable sightings!
